- o FY22 Events/Activities
 - Feedback about the value of conferences that are open to students, like inperson AdCon; keep AdCon in person; If AdCon can't be in person, open November and April conferences to everyone/anyone. Obviously in-person was superior to online.
 - If Students United representatives visited more student organizations, there would be more engagement and feedback
 - After the pitch about shifting Nov and April to open/less committee focused, group expresses interest in that idea
 - Staff pitches another idea about advocacy trainings being monthly, focused on a theme/set of themes? Some hesitation about ease of engagement when it's split up across months. Some express interest in something ongoing that anyone can attend
 - Question about what kind of stuff they'd want to have at our conferences?
 Discussion of key policies, community-building like discussion circles, ability to network and check in with other students from other campuses
 - Question about what kind of stuff they'd want outside of conferences? More state legislative lobbying, more digital connection opportunities for students to meet each other, increase engagement with SU more broadly, maybe monthly staff go and talk to clubs, get SU reps on the ground, on campuses with things like trainings and engagement ideas

Program Outcomes

- Sustainability/environmental sustainability, specifically those being disseminated to campuses and there being accountability
- More involvement of students outside of Poli Sci or outside of the traditional world of those who engage in advocacy and policy, get those nurses, teachers, STEM, business, and other students involved in our work
- Accessibility resources and increasing accessibility
- Policies or practices around exams/testing on weekends or outside of class time

 - MSUM: Housing did okay and responded to pressure, campus covid response committee did a lot of work and were stresses
